

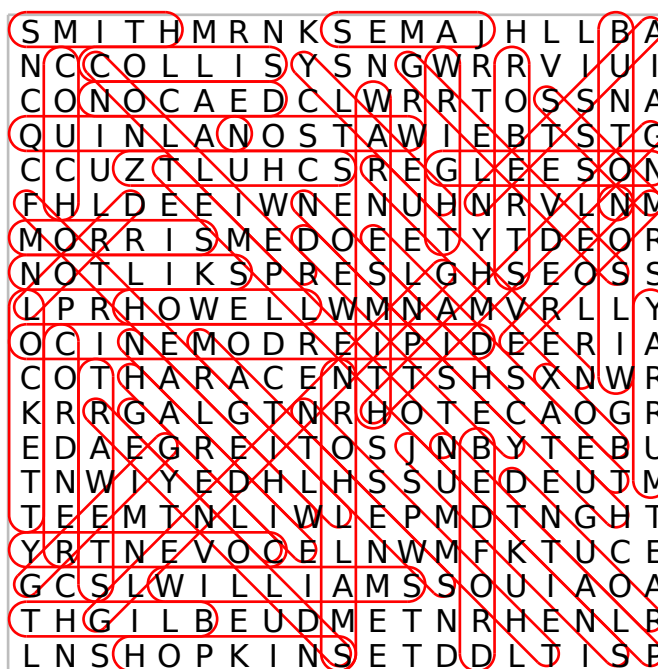
'THE CHARLIE'

The most prestigious individual award in Aussie Rules, the 'Chas.(Charles) Brownlow Trophy', was named in honour of the famous Geelong and V.F.L. administrator Charles Brownlow and has been awarded since 1924 when it was first won by champion Geelong player Edward 'Carji' Greeves.

It is a unique award because it is awarded to the Fairest & Best player, not the Best & Fairest, meaning that many great players have missed out on winning this much sought after medal.

The votes are given by the Field Umpires at the conclusion of the match and are now kept under lock and key until minutes before the televised count begins each Monday before the A.F.L. Grand Final.
